Summary of Project Implementation

The "Extending Resources, Economic Security, and Peace: Enhancing Peace Building through Demarcation of Animal Corridors and Improving Grazing Areas" project promoted peace-building through collaborative natural resource management and support for livelihoods. Targeted activities were designed to help reduce tensions between competing users of natural resources. Collaborative natural resource management projects undertaken included the construction of two improved wells for livestock, the demarcation of animal migration corridors,

and enrichment planting along 10-hectares of pasture along the corridors. The project team also worked with community water users and stakeholders in the two-targeted localities of Zalingei and Wadi Salih to build their capacity to manage these resources and ensure the sustainability of the program.

Despite a slight delay due to heavy rains during the rainy season, the project successfully:

 Demarcated an animal migration corridor from Zalingei to Garsila (113 km).

- Established two water sources (dug wells) along the corridor to provide crucial water resources for people and livestock.
- Designated 10 hectares of managed pastures for livestock grazing and resting (seasonal settlements and temporary resting spaces) through enclosures and enrichment planting with a mixture of drought-tolerant seed along the corridor.
- Formed and trained water committees for operation and maintenance of water sources, and Pasture and Demarcation Committees for management of the grazing corridor.

Progress against output and outcome objectives

Overall Objectives

Reduce tensions between competing users of natural resources through targeted collaborative natural resource management projects.

Considerable awareness raising was conducted with all committees.

Did the activity raise interest and discussions?

NEF's work through the AECOM project has been highly appreciated. Livestock migration corridors have addressed a key concern and point of conflict in the region – demarcating paths and reducing trespassing/damage to crops. The benefits of enrichment planting were also discussed during a meeting held in November 2015, chaired by the Central Darfur Wali and Minister from the Ministry of Agriculture. Farmers, pastoralists, local government officials, and other actors have all acknowledged the role that the demarcation, enrichment planting, water, and awareness raising activities will have in preventing disputes and conflict. Local actors have requested further development of these and similar initiatives.

Given concerns about food security in the coming year as the 2015 rainy season started late and ended early, these will be of particular importance in promoting adequate food production.

Impact on perceptions and behaviors

Project activities have had an impact on mitigating disputes between herders and farmers, particularly in the areas where the grazing route has been demarcated, awareness activities have occurred, and where water points have been constructed.

Recommendations

- Demarcation activities should be completed before or after rainy season to avoid setbacks due to heavy rains.
- Activities should also engage all actors in the area to mitigate potentials for conflict.
- To have optimum use of the corridor, the demarcation should reach its final points in the state.

Lessons learned, challenges and recommendations

Heavy rains delayed the completion of the project as areas became inaccessible and demarcation activities could not be completed. Activities should be planned around the expected rainy season.

Future Steps

- The completion of the whole corridor up to Jugoma Al Garbia should be undertaken to at least finish one corridor.
- Additional water yards and water points are needed throughout the current corridor.
- NEF proposes work on livelihood activities in the targeted areas to support the mutual interest of both herders and farmers (i.e., cheese making, fodder production, etc.)
- NEF also proposes that animal water routes be constructed in case additional water points are not constructed along the main animal routes.
